CONTINUING SUPPORT FOR THE WEST REHOBOTH CHILDREN AND YOUTH PROGRAM

A letter received by LCOS from Brenda Milbourne, Executive Director of the West Rehoboth Children and Youth Program, regarding our support this summer reads in part: "What a blessing you have been and continue to be to our youth program. We are very fortunate to have wonderful support from people like you who continue to make a difference in the lives of our very low-income community. Thank you for all you do for the children to help brighten their future."

The Board of Social Ministry will again provide support for this program during December by collecting "kid friendly" breakfast and lunch non-perishable food which will be served at the West Rehoboth Center during the Cape Henlopen Christmas break to those students who normally are provided these meals at school. In addition, we are also collecting personal health items such as toothbrushes, tooth paste, rolls of toilet paper, shampoo, deodorant, etc. in small size containers which can be sent home in the students' backpacks. We are asking that you begin to keep your eyes out for bargains and begin stocking up on these items, but due to the building expansion which greatly limits our storage space, we ask that you not bring anything to the church until mid-December.

Conversations with Brenda Milbourne have resulted in our decision to ask members of LCOS to also provide gift cards for K-Mart and Walmart in amounts not to exceed \$25.00 rather than us providing the names of children and asking for toys, games or other gifts to be donated. These gift cards will be kept at the West Side New Beginnings Community Center and used by the staff to provide school supplies, shoes, jackets, hats, etc. for the students throughout the winter as they see a need. The decision to provide gift cards rather than specific gifts for the children was made by Social Ministry for two reasons: (1) other non-profit groups often come forth and offer to provide gifts; (2) Brenda sees the need for basic supplies and clothing to be the greater need, especially in light of the difficult economic situation being faced by these families.

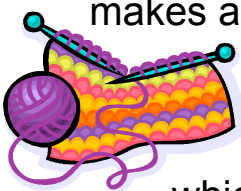

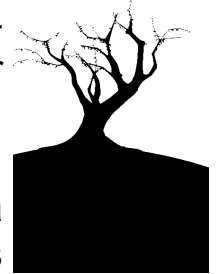


NEW BEREAVEMENT GROUP NOVEMBER 2011

PRAYER LABYRINTH DEDICATION

The Lutheran Church of Our Savior labyrinth, designed and constructed by LCOS member Benjamin Price as his Eagle Scout project, is a classical or “seven circuit” labyrinth. While this ancient design is found in most cultures, it is closely associated with Christianity and found in many churches in Europe. The seven circuits refer to the seven paths that lead to the center, or goal. As with most Christian classical labyrinths, a cross marks the starting point. The cross at the center is the focal point of the experience of the labyrinth and the focus for meditation.

The classical labyrinth’s simplicity of construction was inspired by an easily remembered seed pattern. That inspiration was instrumental in the wide cultural dissemination of the design. It is by far the world's most common form, remaining popular to this day.

The landscaping that surrounds LCOS’ labyrinth was designed and planted by Logan Bellinger as his Eagle Scout project.
